The Word who has continued even as continents have shifted, seas have risen and fallen, eras have played out, rulers have gained and lost power, and the world has been riven with times of war and blessed with seasons of peace. Through droughts, famines and plagues, through verdancy, abundance, and health, the Word has walked and keeps on walking with us, bringing us new life.

At the beginning of this new year, may our resolution be to get in step and walk with the Word who has walked in the world with us from the very beginning. Because our hope is not in the new year or our resolutions or willpower. Our hope is in the One who makes all things new.

December Administrative Committee Highlights

- November financials indicate giving has been steady and right on budget, however, expenses are up due mostly to building repairs that have been necessary. All ministries are asked to tighten their spending as much as possible.
- A new Xerox copier will soon be leased. The 5-year lease should save us about \$500/year. Thanks to Fred Quist for his research and recommendation.
- Tim Spangler and Denny Eliason reviewed our building insurance and recommended an increase in coverage to \$2M. The cost is being researched and will be part of the spring renewal of our insurance plan with Church Mutual.
- A shift from Century Link to Clearnetworx for our phone and internet service is being investigated.
- 2024-2025 budget items will include a review of building repairs as well as other items.
- Spring and summer programs are being planned.
- The next Council Administrative sub-committee meeting will be <u>3 PM</u> on Tuesday, January 9, 2024 at the church—please join us.

Coming in 2024!

UCSJ will be offering two new classes on mindfulness. Mindfulness is the ability to focus our attention fully on the present moment with



acceptance and without judgment. Katy Kristoffersen, our multitalented Music Director, will lead the two courses. You do not have to attend every session in a course—drop-ins are most welcome!

The first course, "Foundational Mindfulness," will have six sessions, which will meet at 4:30 PM starting on Sunday, January 7 and ending on Sunday, February 11. Each session will open with a short (5-minute) meditation, followed by journaling, information presented by Katy on a facet of mindfulness, a group discussion, and closing with a second meditation grounded in the session's content. We will aim to be together for about one hour per session, focusing on bringing mindfulness into a specific category of life, such as attention, the body, and emotion.

The second course, "Christian Mindfulness," will have five sessions, which meet during Lent starting on Sunday, February 18 and ending on Sunday, March 17, at 4:30 PM. This course will follow the same structure as the first course but will focus on specifically Christian topics relating to mindfulness.

These classes are open to all people in our community (not just church members), including teens. For more information visit ucsjridgway.org/mindfulness. Please feel free to invite anyone you think might be interested.

He freighted over roads that were scarcely more than trails and where there was no road at all he built one. His huge freight wagons hauled out ore and hauled in food, machinery, dynamite, coal and everything needed at the mines. Dave Wood spent his later years at his

ranch south of Dallas a few miles north of Ridgway. This is a story of his life 1878 to 1944. This is an excellent presentation given to the Ouray Historical Society a year ago.

PRESBYTERIANS — The Unification Commission will get to the work of determining how and when the Presbyterian Mission Agency and Office of General Assembly will become one. Working with staff, a three-member appointed task force will help commissioners with standing rules and procedures in the lead-up to the GA226 in Salt Lake City, Utah. During a Zoom meeting on Saturday, December 16, the Unification Commission voted to approve the formation of a small task force to work with staff to review its charter "and all polity, process and procedural issues" related to the commission's upcoming report to the 226th General Assembly on January 18-20, 2024 in Louisville, Kentucky and make recommendations to the Unification Commission at its next meeting. 
