April 5th will mark 4 months since my mother died. In some ways it seems like she just "took flight." Those were the words my brother wrote in the text he sent to say she was gone—the one I received at the gate as I was waiting to take a flight to see her.

I have been pondering that idea of taking flight, especially as we walk from Lent into this Easter tide. There is so much in life that can clip our wings, drag us down, and keep us grounded. My wings have seemed clipped to me these past 4 months. Some days my heart has been so heavy it felt as if it would fall out of my chest.

Grief is a strange experience, as many of you know. It comes. It goes. It hovers. It settles in. It goes again. It rearranges things: your sense of self, the fabric of your world, your memory, your sense of time, your sleep, everything, basically. And while grief does that for you, the world continues on at the pace it has ever gone. Bills must still be paid, laundry done, groceries shopped for, meals cooked, errands run, the house cleaned, sermons preached, and so on.

It can be a very tough walk, this walking with grief. It's best not done alone. That is why I am so grateful for each of you. On hard days, I go through the stack of cards you sent. I go back through your texts. Your kind condolences, your hugs, your patience, understanding, and grace have lifted that heaviness when I could not get out from under it myself. I feel a few new feathers starting to grow in those clipped places.

At first, it was just too tender to say much about—it can still be. Things were hard to put into words—they sometimes still are. I figure it will be that way for a good while. At the same time, I have felt covered in your prayers, care, grace, and love. All those things have given me the strength to keep walking and working through the heaviness of this time. You have been, in your own special and unique ways, helping me carry this burden and walking with me toward a new sense of home.

When I was serving the church in Glenwood, we were talking about why being present in the community that is church is important. One woman, talking about people for whom the outdoors is their church, said, "I get that. I love the outdoors, too, but a tree can't come to your door with a hug and encouraging words. I need you all to do that!" And so do I—and so do we all. Thank God we are church for one another! And thank you for showing how wonderful church can be.

March Full Council Highlights

Your UCSJ Council met on March 12 and began with a devotional entitled "Touching on Teamwork." Pastor Melinda reminded us that we are all parts of one body and have many varied gifts and that the Council is to use this model for collaborating with each other and you. Besides the usual approval of minutes and financials, the Council approved **Linda Ingo** as Financial Assistant—the one who organizes the plate counters; approved a Safety & Security Policy; approved Job Descriptions for the Technical Support Consultant (audio-visual operator) and the Administrative Assistant; and appointed a Safety Team. The meeting was closed in prayer. Tuesday, April 9, at 4:30 PM will be an Administrative Committee meeting, which will include discussion on insurance, planning the June Annual meeting, and beginning the budgeting process. Please attend if you have any ideas or concerns.

The Nominating Committee met on March 18. This team will discern and recruit church members to fill several council positions. Positions that are open and will be voted on at the June annual meeting include Vice-chair Ministry, Vicechair Operations, Care Ministry, Education Ministry, Membership Ministry and Nominating Committee (which consists of two council members and three congregational members). The two current council members of Vice-chair positions are willing to provide leadership for another two years and run for a second term; these are Donna Whiskeman (Ministry) and Joan Moyer (Operations). Please pray about filling one of the open positions and let the Nominating Committee know of your interest, they can also answer your questions about time commitment and responsibilities. Tom Chase is the chair of this committee, and members include Cindi Myers, Alice Goertz, Joan Moyer, and Donna Whiskeman.

Advertising for the Administrative Assistant continues through March. Pastor Melinda, Admin Assistant Anita, and Council Chair will interview applicants and present their recommendation to council for approval.

Anita Posey has done an amazing job as Administrative Assistant and her attention to detail and art design will be missed, however, she will still be worshiping with us. Thanks, Anita for your service and dedication.

Exciting News About the UCSJ Endowment Fund

The placement of the UCSJ Endowment Fund money under the management of the Texas Presbyterian Foundation (TPF) in June 2022 diversified portfolio that includes a money market, stocks, and fixed income



has proven to be a good move. Our money at TPF has been invested in a broadly securities. As a result, the value of our Endowment Fund has grown from \$12,345 in 2022 to \$14,542 as of February 29, 2024 for an increase of almost 18%. Increasing the value of the UCSJ Endowment Fund through good investments

is exciting. However, WE STILL NEED YOUR HELP in order to make the value of the Fund become large enough to provide for periodic distributions of the investment income for special needs of the church. Any contribution would be beneficial and can be as simple as a Direct Gift of cash or as sophisticated as a Deferred Gift through your will.



The United Church of the San Juans

HI everyone — I am appealing for volunteers to get called by Church Mutual if there is a fire at church. This is not your fathers smoke alarm system that goes off monthly. Rather, I strongly suspect this will never happen, and I also want to point out that the alarm first goes to me and gives me 90 seconds to silence it or do something. If I get an alarm, I am likely to silence it and then call the fire department so you will only get called if I don't respond. So this is highly unlikely to happen—only one individual has volunteered but I think we need a few more church members to agree with my request.

With assistance from Michael Moore and Fred Quist, we have installed a new fire alarm system supported by Church Mutual, our insurance company.

The system has two components: first there is a conventional smoke alarm, with ten year batteries. Right next to the smoke alarm is a microphone system that listens for the smoke alarm to go off—and notifies Church Mutual through a base station located on the table in the lobby. There are two sensors in the sanctuary, one in the lobby, and one in the office.

Right now, my personal iPhone is the mother ship. When an alarm sounds, my phone and iPad both light up with visual and audio alarms. If I don't cancel the alarm in 90 seconds, then Church Mutual will intervene and begin calling a list of phone numbers. We need to have five people who are willing to have their phone numbers listed with Church Mutual to respond, and it would be best if the phone numbers are church members in the Ridgway area because I am on Log Hill Mesa. The chances of this all happening are very, very low—we have not had a fire in our church ever, and remember the first alert goes to me no matter where I am (even France like last month). I am thinking of adding a camera in the Sanctuary to our Ring Camera system so that I can look at the camera if an alarm goes off, to see if anything is going on.

So let me know if you are willing to have your phone number listed. I am going to meet with the fire department and talk about what they would like our response to be. Some departments will only respond to a verified alarm and so we may be required to have someone go to the church to check—or call the Marshal or Sheriff to check. This is TBD.
