The Language of Pentecost

When the Feast of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. Without warning there was a sound like a strong wind, gale force—no one could tell where it came from. It filled the whole building. Then, like a wildfire, the Holy Spirit spread through their ranks, and they started speaking in a number of different languages as the Spirit prompted them.

— Acts 2:1-4 (The Message)

Out walking the other day in my neighborhood, I heard two neighbors talking politics at the edge of their yards. I had not been close enough to hear their whole conversation, but as I neared them, I heard one of them say to the other, "I knew we'd be speaking the same language at the ballot box!" We all waved, and I heard them continuing their discussion as I walked on by.

All kinds of things speak our language, and we are constantly listening to hear it. Back in February, after we hosted the Shrove Tuesday pancake brunch at the church for Neighbor to Neighbor, I mentioned to Anita how good the church smelled. "It does!" she said. "It smells like a country kitchen." And it did. Immediately, I thought of the kitchen in the farmhouse where my grandfather grew up. It's where we stayed when we visited his extended family. That family table spoke to all of us who sat around it: homegrown vegetables, plates full of tasty food prepared with love from long-cooked recipes—and a few new ones—family stories, jokes and life lessons, farm weather forecasts, plantings and harvests, price indexes on wheat and cattle, and whatever community gossip was hot at any moment. Mixed into all of that, was the language of us as a family and of what we valued as we made our way in the world—even though some of us at that table were growing up off the farm in other places. There was a sense of timelessness as we gathered there, and of deep connection to a way of living that had meaning and purpose, and helped us make sense of the world across all the generations.

These days we still listen closely for "our language," even though we do so now less around the family kitchen table and more through 24-hour news feeds, streaming podcasts, and social media platforms. We still seek that connection that will give our lives meaning and purpose, and help us make sense of the world around us.

On that Feast of Pentecost day long, long ago, the disciples were also listening for "our language" as they contemplated what was next after Jesus' ascension into heaven. They were expecting a certain kind of "voice," a certain kind of "language." What the Holy Spirit brought in gale-force winds and wildfire was not a certain kind of language, but all

And that is how Christ's Church was born—speaking a language that bridged all those separate languages, making "our language," a language we could all understand no matter where we come from. And that is our call as church, to speak and act in ways that place no limit on love, so that love is what people see and hear when they come around this "table" that is Christ's Church. May it be so.

Pastor Melinda's contract is up for renewal in June, an appraisal has been conducted, and a contract will be presented at the June 11 Council meeting for approval.

The budget process for Fiscal year 24-25 will be in May, Annual reports will be sent out on June 2 and the Annual meeting is scheduled for June 16. Business at the Annual meeting will include approval of the Annual Report and the proposed budget for next fiscal year and the presentation of candidates for the Council and Nominating committee.
