I could have left the church before it started, and I had every excuse to, since I was at the end of my church-related hours for the day. But I'm so glad I did not. To spend that kind of time with others was just what I needed to keep me remembering that God is alive and well and at work among us as we share our hearts and our lives.

Proverbs 17:22 says, "A merry heart does good, like a medicine, but a broken spirit dries the bones." A community made merry by the honest sharing of faith is always good medicine. When life gets real, as it does for all of us, it is those gatherings where we share how life has gotten real, where we've been broken, and how we've healed that is the good medicine that keeps us walking that path of love. And walking the path of love with the Lord of Love is what church is all about, so if you haven't yet, come get some good medicine on Wednesday evenings. I guarantee it will bring healing to whatever happens to be ailing you—or make merrier the heart you come with.

Church function is no longer vested principally in one ordained individual." This is the position to which Pastor Melinda and we are called.

She is here to support, teach and guide us on our spiritual journey and we are here to support and engage in ministry together with her, as well. 


