

Make me to know your ways, O Lord; teach me your paths. Lead me in your truth, and teach me, for you are the God of my salvation; for you I wait all day long.

— Psalm 25:4-5

The year has launched with gray days, cold wind, and loads of snow, but also with sparkling clear days and that blue, blue sky that pops over the white landscape. Skijoring is past, ice climbing is fast approaching, and so is the trek from Ash Wednesday to Easter.

Lent begins on February 14th, with a soup supper at 6 PM at the church, followed by the Ash Wednesday service at 7 PM, which leads us into the 40 days of Lent. Lent comes early this year—and Easter, too. It seems as if we just walked through Advent and Christmas. Haven't we done enough reflecting for a while? Good question!

Often people focus on giving up something for Lent, like a bad habit or a particular food. They concentrate on how wrong these things are and the problems they can create for them. They use Lent as a time to get back on track in their lives. But the heart of Lent is really not about us, our productivity, or our success. The heart of Lent, its focus, is the self-sacrificial love of God.

So perhaps rather than taking something away from our lives, we would benefit by adding something to them. I'm not talking about an exercise routine or a diet. I'm talking about a practice that we can do sitting at our desks, out on a walk or hike, looking out the kitchen window, having coffee with a friend, or sitting quietly for 5 minutes. It's the practice of being on the lookout for where God is present. You may be looking out the window when a storm begins to blanket the mountaintops with snow. You may be having coffee with a friend, when your conversation goes from the surface to sharing from the heart. You may be out on a walk or a hike, and out of the corner of your eye, you catch a fox or a deer, a hawk or an elk.

Each day we are surrounded by gifts of God's Spirit. As we walk through Lent, we have an opportunity to practice growing mindful of the ways the Spirit is ever present, ever at work, ever giving life and breath. Letting that truth settle into the core of our lives changes everything in a way an exercise routine, a diet, or trying to master a bad habit can never do. That mindfulness opens us to the presence of the Spirit. And as we open ourselves more and more to God's Spirit of self-sacrificing love, that love works on us and shapes us in ways we could never have asked for or imagined. This Lent, I invite us all to practice attending to the Spirit and to experience the beauty and the wholeness that is always present with us when we do.

January Administrative Committee Highlights

Your Administrative Council sub-committee met on January 9, 2024.

- December financials indicated giving to date is right on budget, however, as has previously been noted, necessary building repairs have put the expenses over budget.
- Our internet and phone service will be changed from CenturyLink to Clearnet Worx with a slight savings per month.
- Our Church Mutual Insurance coverage for the church will be increased to reflect current replacement costs. Members of the Safety group are installing smoke and water alarms with Church Mutual providing free monitoring as part of our insurance coverage.
- The final bill for our audio-visual project has been paid with approximately \$3k remaining in the AV account. Research is being done on the cost of modifying the closet doors for easier access to the new mobile TV and cart.
- It was noted that advertising costs are increasing and will be over budget by the end of this fiscal year.
- Rev. Melinda's travel schedule for this spring was presented including vacation, study, and bereavement leave. See below for more details.
- Our next meeting will be with the FULL Council on February 13 at 4:30 PM here at the church. Please join us.

Pastor's Plans for 2024 Travel

Pastor Melinda presented her travel plans via email to the Council and discussed them at the most recent Administrative Council meeting on January 9th. Her contract specifies four weeks of vacation and two weeks of study leave. The Council generously offered that she not use vacation or study leave for the time she would be gone in January to celebrate her mother's life and help her father as he works to close up her estate.

She and the members of Council present at the meeting agreed that it would be good for the congregation to be "in the know" about her travel schedule, as well, so below is a list of dates that she will be out for bereavement, study leave, and vacation.

This seminar for pastors who preach regularly will be held at Ghost Ranch in Abiquiu, NM. Led by three professors at Luther Seminary in St. Paul, MN, this seminar will focus on providing resources for preaching: approaches to study, resources for study, approaches to developing sermons and to preaching them. Pastor Melinda uses their online resources weekly, and this promises to be a rich time for continuing to grow in study and practice.



PRESBYTERIANS — Months in advance, the Presbyterian Peacemaking Program has begun gearing up to welcome this year's contingent of International Peacemakers and is now accepting applications from entities that would like to host them. The program has announced nearly a dozen 2024 peacemakers, who will spend four weeks in September and October visiting churches, presbyteries and educational institutions in person—something that wasn't possible during the height of the pandemic when a virtual symposium served as a creative alternative. 
