Go after a life of love as if your life depended on it—because it does... Let me tell you something wonderful, a mystery I'll probably never fully understand. We're not all going to die—but we are all going to be changed.

— 1 Corinthians 14:1 and 15:51

These words from The Message translation of Paul's first letter to the Corinthians grabbed me when I read them. I had just found this picture of the empty tomb with the light shining into the darkness over the "unmanned" burial cloths. The dove in flight, illuminated by the rays over the words "He is not here for he has risen," set my mind imagining Jesus rushing from the tomb to push Love back into the world from the depths of death and darkness. I saw Love getting out there in full force in a whole new way to give new life.

Just a few verses down in that same chapter of 1 Corinthians, Paul repeats an old saying, now in light of the resurrection of Christ:

Death swallowed by triumphant Life! Who got the last word, O Death?

O Death, who's afraid of you now?

It looked as if Death had won, as we always think it will. Yet, here was Jesus out and about—in the garden with Mary, with two disciples on the Road to Emmaus, and then in the Upper Room, where he appeared, to his disciples huddled in fear, trying to comprehend what had just happened. Now, with Love in the room, they had a whole other kind of comprehending to do!

Through the centuries there have been many ways to understand the Resurrection, how it happened, and what it means for us. There have been countless theories from countless theologians, theorists, scientists, and philosophical ponderers detailing whether Jesus either was or was not resurrected in body as well as spirit. To our 21st century minds (and to minds from the 20th, 19th, 18th and so on, down the centuries) it is a real challenge to fathom how that could even be possible.

But here is the truth about the Resurrection and about the Christ we follow: Death does not win. It doesn't get the final word on who we are or what we can do. No matter how much darkness attempts to set up shop in the world, the power of Christ's light will ever break it. Our fear, our doubt, our hesitancy to trust may blind us to that truth, but, thankfully, the Light of Christ shines whether we are on the lookout for it or not.

Yet, when we pursue Love as if our lives depend on it—because they do—somehow, we begin to see the Light of Christ in the most unlikely places. And the more we see it, the brighter it shines, and the more it fuels our pursuit of Love. So, as we go on in this season of Easter, may we pursue Love with all we've got, and may we be changed in ways that only Love can do.

February Administrative Committee Highlights

- January financials show a \$7,000 deficit in the budget, which is a concern. The Texas Presbyterian Foundation investment has been profitable. The congregational giving to Directed Contributions was very good.
- The sliding door to the new AV TV needed to be changed. The committee approved Rick Blackford's estimate to change the door for \$600 which would come out of the AV projects funds.
- Mike Kristoffersen will take over the responsibilities for the audio system from Fred Quist. The committee discussed the need for more information to develop a job description and to increase his salaried position per a recommendation by the Worship & Music Ministry Committee.
- The committee approved Donna Whiskeman's recommendation to compensate Ed Pecis with a gift certificate for his training services to the Safety and Security program.
- The committee discussed the need to form a committee to discuss how we can use social media, why we want to be on social media, and are we using it effectively.
- Anita Posey has resigned from her position as Administrative Assistant. The committee reviewed the process for replacement—advertising, job description, etc.
- The next FULL Council meeting will be at 4:30 PM on Tuesday, March 12, at the church. All are welcome.

We really value your feedback and help!



UNITED CHURCH OF CHRIST — 'The consistent theme is love': In new year, UCC National Setting builds on 'one-staff model' by Maic D'Agostino published on Feb 6, 2024 (read more here).

As the calendar turned to 2024, the United Church of Christ national ministry teams began working under three new sets of names, unified by a theme of "love."

Love of Service. Love of Church. Love of Neighbor. These are the overarching designations—connected to the heart of the UCC's <u>mission and vision</u>—that identify the many, diverse ministries performed by the national staff.

"The responsibilities of the units and their names are based on the mission, vision and purpose statements of the UCC," said General Minister and President the Rev. Karen Georgia Thompson. "The Purpose Statement, the UCC reason for being, is drawn from a passage in Matthew's Gospel: 'To love God with all our heart, mind, soul and strength, and our neighbor as ourselves.'"

The mission and vision statements likewise refer specifically to unity and love.

"The consistent theme is love," Thompson said. "The church emphasizes and moves on the love of God given freely to us."

METHODISTS — We look at a message about Lent and Ash Wednesday from our Methodist Brothers and Sisters.

At Easter, United Methodists across the world join with other Christians to celebrate the Risen Christ!

The journey to Easter begins on Ash Wednesday as we pause to reflect on this holy day of repentance. As we move through the 40 days of Lent, we may choose to praise and worship the Lord; to read the Bible more, and to pray more often, all in preparation for celebrating the most sacred of days.
