I spent the early part of May at CREDO, a time of focused retreat that the Presbyterian Church (USA) offers to clergy serving congregations across the nation. CREDO provides a space to reflect on specific areas of our lives, our level of health in them, and ways we would like to grow into greater health as we go forward in ministry.

When I registered, I did not know it would be held at Ferncliff Camp and Conference Center just outside of Little Rock, Arkansas. My mother grew up in Little Rock, and her parents were instrumental in helping start the camp. All my life Ferncliff has been part of my fabric. It was a gift to be there.

It was also a gift for another reason: How much it had changed. In the 70s and 80s, Ferncliff was in decline. Its summer camper numbers were low. Its other programs were struggling. Its leadership was stuck in how it used to be. They couldn't see where God might be leading.

A new director came in the mid-1990s. The board began identifying its mission and envisioning new ways to live it out. Ferncliff had always had a heart for healing. After the shootings at Columbine High School, Ferncliff invited students from the school to a special camp to help them deal with trauma. They were the first in a long line of young people from around the world to benefit from those camps. Ferncliff had always had a heart for helping. Soon an area of the camp became a packing and distribution area for Presbyterian Disaster Assistance. Ferncliff had always had a heart for lifting people up. It invited low-income families from the Little Rock area to send their kids to summer camp at reduced rates. It became a national training site for Solar Under the Sun, an inter-denominational program that installs solar panels on homes in towns and villages in Central and South America. All of that began to turn Ferncliff in a whole new direction, albeit with the mission that had always been at its heart. The old cabins in the picture up top on the left and the new camper yurts up top on the right speak volumes about how their approach to housing campers has changed. No more square cabins, now it's yurts!

This sounds like a commercial for Ferncliff, but it's not. It's just a great example of what can happen when we are open to change. This month, the Long-Range Visioning Team (LRVT) will begin the same work of discernment that Ferncliff did. They will begin again to look at our mission, the world beyond our doors, and God's call to us to express the great heart of this great church in new, relevant, and exciting ways. You will all have a chance to participate in that process, too. In worship and in special times together, we will be praying, talking, listening, and considering this church's life as it moves ahead. The LRVT will help us with the heavy lifting, as they meet regularly to pray, study, talk, listen, dream, and discern new directions as we look ahead. Together, we will be on the lookout, seeking to joyfully follow the One who leads us.

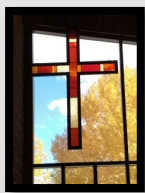

## May Council Highlights

The UCSJ Council meeting in May consisted of preliminary discussion of the 2024-25 Budget, compensation policy for our Pastor, and communication task force policy. The only action items were minutes and April financials. Other concerns included reminding the congregation to lock the doors when leaving, respecting each other with quiet contemplation during the service, making sure the building maintenance team monitors the smoke alarm app and leaving the church office as you found it. The Council had a second meeting in May to finalize the proposed 2024-25 Budget for congregational approval at the Annual Meeting, June 16, 2024.

The **Annual Congregational meeting will be Sunday, June 16, 2024**, immediately following the Sunday worship service. All active members are allowed to vote. Two weeks notice of the meeting, the agenda, annual report, proposed budget and election slate will be sent electronically to all active members, those active members who do not have email will be U.S. mailed a paper copy. Voting can be done during the month of June either electronically or by paper. The election slate consists of Joan Moyer, Vice Chairperson of Operations (2 years); Donna Whiskeman, Vice Chairperson of Ministry (2 years); Alice Goertz, Care Representative (2 years); Tom Chase, Membership Representative (1 year); Tim Spangler, Worship & Music Representative (2 years); Vince Snowbarger, Education Representative (2 years); Joan Moyer and Tom Chase, Nominating Committee Council Reps (1 year), Charlotte Duckett, Betsy Lattanner, and Anita Posey, Nominating Committee Congregational Reps (1 year). **Please plan on attending our Annual meeting.**

## A Financial Review and Forecast

As you can see in the Treasurer's statement on page 3, UCSJ is experiencing a very unusual situation with this year's contributions and expenses. Our contributions were doing quite well through March but in April we fell \$9,500 under budget. At the same time, Council has had to deal with many unplanned maintenance items for our building and grounds that has resulted in a substantial increase in expenditures. Our building is 15 years old and requires more maintenance. A short list of projects includes: furnace and air conditioning repairs, ceiling fans replaced, drainage excavation outside pastor's door, aspen trees removed, and landscaping. **This has resulted in a \$19,300 shortfall.**

As Council is preparing for the upcoming Annual Meeting, it is crucial that we are able to accurately forecast what the congregation is willing to support in these times of rising costs, expanding programs, and building maintenance projects. **Please prayerfully consider what you can do to support UCSJ.**

## COED (Men's) Breakfast — Saturday, June 15 at 8:30 AM

Our speaker will be **C J Brafford** who was born on the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation and is an enrolled tribal member of the Oglala Lakota Nation. Her presentation will be about her experiences over the years as a tribal member and her work at the Ute Museum. C J Brafford moved to Montrose, Colorado, 26 years ago as the Director of the Ute Indian Museum. We are fortunate to have her as a guest speaker for she is scheduled to retire this fall. Prior to coming to Colorado, C J worked for the Grand Tetons National Park over seeing 8,000 pieces of the park's museum collection. She was also the museum curator for the David T Vernon Indian Arts museum. C J's education background includes the institute of American Indian Arts, Northern Arizona University, and Arizona State University. She graduated from all three schools obtaining degrees in Cultural Anthropology and Museum Studies. She authored a book *Dancing Colors*, which explores the lives of the Native American women. In 2004, C J took part, with great honor, in the opening of the National Museum of American Indians in Washington, DC and was selected Miss Congeniality in 1983 in the Miss Indian America Pageant.

Over the years, C J has been associated with various organizations as a board chair or board member. Some of the organizations are as follows: The American Association for State and Local History, American Indian Museum Association, Colorado most endangered Places (grant reviewer), Native Voices Foundation, Montrose Tourism, Black Canyon National Park, Colorado Aspen Film Festival, Colorado Land Trust, and local Clubs. She was also the recipient of the Spirit Award for Colorado Woman's Day in 2022. Please sign up in the gathering area.

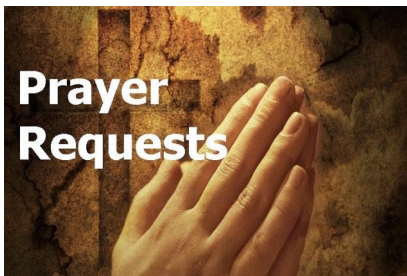
