Recently in worship, we spent a little time reviewing our UCSJ Mission Statement. As you know, it was written when the church was formed back in 2003. Our Mission Statement expresses a standard for our life as a church. It helps us keep in mind who we are and what we are about:

- We are a loving and compassionate church family that *respects the dignity* and integrity of each individual.
- We find our joy and meaning through faith in God and Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit.
- We seek to promote Christian unity and to encourage understanding and cooperation with those from different traditions.
- We seek to foster deeper relationships with God and each other through worship, fellowship, growth and service.

At the church picnic on June 12th at Pa-Co-Chu-Puk—hosted by our amazing Congregational Fellowship Team (Carolyn Snowbarger, Charlotte Duckett, Anne Linenberger, Elise Shirey, Kay Sibold, and Donna Whiskeman)—we had three topics for table conversation: 1) Where were you living before you joined or began coming to UCSJ? 2) What was your occupation before you became involved in the church? 3) What other churches have you been a part of, and what made them "home" for you? The goal was two-fold: to get a sense of our varied individual experiences and to foster deeper relationships as we had time in fellowship with one another.

The answers varied widely. Just on the first topic, among 31 people, it was clear that we had lived in a LOT of different places: Arizona, California, Colorado, Illinois, Iowa, Minnesota, Mississippi, Missouri, Nebraska, North Dakota, Ohio, Oklahoma, Oregon, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia, Washington, and Wisconsin. Professionally, we were doctors, nurses, real estate agents, teachers, architects, attorneys, grocers, administrators, folks who had worked for a state, salesclerks, and small business owners. And in terms of church affiliation, we had been part of Presbyterian, Lutheran, charismatic, Methodist, Mormon, Catholic, nondenominational, Mennonite, Episcopal, Baptist, and Nazarene churches, to name just a few.

As diverse as our experiences have been, it was clear that we also have much in common as we find our joy and meaning through faith in God and Jesus Christ and as we seek with intention to understand and cooperate with one another as members and participants in this church. As the Long-Range Visioning Team picks up the reins after taking a hiatus to allow me to get my feet back on the ground after my mother's death, we will be further exploring this mission statement and the ways we are living it out 21 years later, both within and beyond the walls of this church. And thanks to the picnickers who so actively participated in conversation. You were demonstrating just how much of a guide our Mission Statement is as you engaged and shared with one another.

LUTHERANS — Rocky Mountain Synod of the ELCA held its annual synod assembly in Loveland, Colorado. Arline and I were in attendance representing UCSJ at the meeting. The election of a new bishop was the main topic of the assembly and we were privileged to represent you and take part in selecting a new bishop. We also had the opportunity to thank Bishop Jim Gonia for his service and thank him for his support of our UCSJ congregation. Bishop Jim has spoken about us for many years and was proud to visit and be a part of our worship service during his time as Bishop.

Our New Bishop for the next six years will be Dr. Rev. Meghan Johnson Aelabouni. Arline and I think she will be a valuable asset for the Rocky Mountain Synod.

Rocky Mountain Synod has established a ministry in the Denver jail. New Beginnings is an ecumenical ministry located in the Women's Prison and is served by a full time Lutheran Pastor. It is designed to provide opportunity for women to change their life style and experience Christian fellowship. I have a link for you to check out this ministry.
