This month marks the start of fall—where has the summer gone? It seems just last week we were celebrating the 4th of July, and now we are right in front of Labor Day. And that has me thinking about how time marches on—and calls us to keep pace.

When you receive this newsletter, more

than a week will have passed between your reading and the day I wrote this article. By the time you read this, the Long Range Visioning Group may already have met on Sunday, August 25th after church to take a deep look at the mission statement that has been the rock-solid foundation of this church since its beginning. Talk about time marching on—that was 21+ years ago.

Earlier in the summer I had visited with one of the people who helped put the mission statement together. He said, "I've read that the Long Range Visioning Group will be exploring the mission statement. You aren't planning to write a new one for the church, are you?"

That idea had not occurred to me at all. Most churches have no clear mission statement to start with that guides their ministry. This church, on the other hand, has one that is included in the worship order every Sunday. We see it all the time. In fact, the sentences below will be very familiar to you:

- We are a loving and compassionate church family that respects the dignity and integrity of each individual.
- We find our joy and meaning through faith in Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit.
- We seek to promote Christian unity and to encourage understanding and cooperation with those from different traditions.
- We seek to foster deeper relationships with God and each other through worship, fellowship, growth, and service.

This is a great mission statement! But mission statements are only words if we are not living them. How we are living them out now, and how we will live them as we continue time's march is the focus of the group as we vision for the next phases in the life of this congregation.

They'll be answering questions like these—I would love to hear your responses to them, as well:

- 1) Describe what it means to you to be a loving and compassionate church family. What is involved in that? How are we being that right now? What would it look like to expand on that?
- 2) What does it look like to you to respect the dignity and integrity of each individual? How are we doing that now? In what ways might we not be doing that?
- 3) With all the diversity of opinions, faith and life experience, world perspectives what are the challenges as we seek to promote unity and encourage understanding and cooperation?


What's Up?

New Community Volunteer Opportunity with the Ouray County Sheriff's Department

The Ouray County Sheriff's Department recognizes the need to provide spiritual support to our citizens and law enforcement officers from time to time. With that in mind, the department is creating a volunteer Sheriff's Chaplain program. We are seeking interested clergy and congregants from local churches to participate as trained volunteer chaplains.



The volunteer chaplains will:

- Participate in scheduled chaplain meetings
- Often accompany deputies on ride-a-longs during their shift
- Provide spiritual support in situations to both law enforcement personnel and those whose situation law enforcement has been called on to address
- From time-to-time respond to deaths and complete death notifications
- Visit at the hospital and attend funerals if requested

A brief overview of preparation for this volunteer program includes:

- An interview with the Sheriff and coordinator
- A background check to assess eligibility
- Participation in a training program to equip volunteer chaplains

Training and uniform shirt will be provided through the Sheriff's Office. Once a team of volunteer chaplains has been assembled, we will create a participation roster that works to accommodate the volunteers' schedules.
