OLD TESTAMENT SCRIPTURE READING Job 1:1; 2:1-10 Mick Graff

EPISTLE READING

Hebrews 1:5; 2:5-12

Since Christians and Jesus have one and the same Father, Jesus is not ashamed to call us brothers and sisters. For to which of the angels did God ever say, "You are my Son; today I have begotten you"? Or again, "I will be his Father and he will be my Son"?

Now God did not subject the coming world, about which we are speaking, to angels. But someone has testified somewhere,

"What are human beings that you are mindful of them, or mortals, that you care for them? You have made them for a little while lower than the angels; you have crowned them with glory and honor, subjecting all things under their feet."

Now, in subjecting all things to them, God left nothing outside their control. As it is, we do not yet see everything in subjection to them, but we do see Jesus, who for a little while was made lower than the angels, now crowned with glory and honor because of the suffering of death, so that by the grace of God he might taste death for everyone.

It was fitting that God, for whom and through whom all things exist, in bringing many children to glory, should make the pioneer of their salvation perfect through sufferings. GOSPEL READING

Mark 10:2-16

The Pharisees ask Jesus about the lawfulness of divorce, and Jesus replies that God's intention is that no husband and wife will separate; then Jesus tells his disciples not to prevent the people who were bringing children to him from doing so, and he takes the children in his arms and blesses them.

Some Pharisees came, and to test him they asked, "Is it lawful for a man to divorce his wife?" He answered them, "What did Moses command you?" They said, "Moses allowed a man to write a certificate of dismissal and to divorce her." But Jesus said to them, "Because of your hardness of heart he wrote this commandment for you. But from the beginning of creation, 'God made them male and female.' For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh.' So they are no longer two, but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, let no one separate." Then in the house in the house the disciples asked him again about this matter. He said to them, "Whoever divorces his wife and marries another commits adultery against her; and if she divorces her husband and marries another, she commits adultery."

People were bringing little children to him in order that he might touch them; and the disciples spoke sternly to them. But when Jesus saw this, he was indignant and said to them, "Let the little children come to me; do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs. Truly I tell you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will never enter it." And he took them up in his arms, laid his hands on the, and blessed them.

Bruce Taylor is a retired minister member of the Presbytery of Denver. A graduate of Littleton High School, Northwestern University, the University of Denver School of Law, the Iliff School of Theology, and Union Theological Seminary in Virginia (now Union Presbyterian Seminary), his doctoral dissertation was a history of Presbyterian missions and ministries to the Navajos. Raised in the First Presbyterian Church of Littleton and serving his internship at Wellshire Presbyterian Church, he was ordained by Denver Presbytery in 1983 and then served churches in north Dallas; Norfolk, Nebraska; Dodge City, Kansas; and was the organizing pastor of Spanish Springs Presbyterian Church in Sparks, Nevada, a suburb of Reno. He retired after serving in Ponca City, Oklahoma. For twelve years, he was secretary/ treasurer of the Association for Reformed & Liturgical Worship. He was also a contributor to the revised edition of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) *Book of Common Worship* (2018). This summer, Wipf and Stock Publishers published his eleventh book, titled *Practicing the Promise*, and his twelfth book, *To Be a Disciple*, will appear this fall. Bruce is a member of the Presbytery's Committee on Preparation for Ministry. A skier, amateur archaeologist, and pilot, he has three adult children and one stepson, all living on the West Coast. He and his wife, Linda, live at Pine Junction, southwest of Denver.
