In the midst of all the darkness in the world, the thought that light is powerful enough to take it on and stand right in the middle of it is comforting and hopeful.

Yet darkness has a pretty strong track record. Wars, poverty, racism, famine, violence, addictions, betrayal, deception, injustice, corruption, and so on. The list of its accomplishments is long.

So, calling out darkness and elevating light seems a little naïve, actually, given the ways darkness brings deep shadows to our lives and to our world. Yet that is exactly what the season of Epiphany does. It focuses us on the light and its ability to infiltrate and keep shining in the midst of the worst the world has to give.

The magi who travel hundreds of miles to pay homage to Jesus are part of a long line, many generations, of sky watchers, looking into the darkness, searching for the light. And when they finally see it, after centuries of waiting and watching, they launch out to meet it where it is living. It is no short journey, no easy effort. It takes determined intention to get to the light. When they arrive, though the source of light may not have been what they were expecting, they recognize it and open themselves to it as they bow and present their gifts at the manger.

The American Heritage Dictionary of the English Language defines "epiphany" as:

- 1) A Christian feast celebrating the manifestation of the divine nature of Jesus to the Gentiles as represented by the Magi.
- 2) A revelatory manifestation of a divine being.
- 3) A sudden insight or intuitive understanding.

The trip of the magi encompasses all three of those. The magi not only experienced a revelatory manifestation of a divine being, but they also received a "sudden insight and intuitive understanding" of the new way God was now at work in the world, crossing barriers and building bridges across them.

The season of Epiphany not only contrasts the light and shadow in the world, but it focuses us on the way the Spirit of Christ is at work in the midst of the darkest of places. Epiphany calls us to open the darker places in our own lives to the light, to receive it, be healed by it, and then to carry it with us as we walk out in the world.

The first Sunday in January is Epiphany Sunday. In worship we'll be celebrating the magi and their trip to the light in worship—and God's invitation to us to live in light—and we'll carry that over from worship as we gather for lunch afterward. I hope you will join us. There will be plenty of food—and lots of light!

then imprisoned in Buchenwald and Auschwitz concentration camps. Finally, he was rescued by Allied soldiers. In 1950 he moved to Australia and spent the next 45 years telling his story, sharing his wisdom, and paying tribute to those who were lost.

New Community Volunteer Opportunity with the Ouray County Sheriff's Department

The Ouray County Sheriff's Department recognizes the need to provide spiritual support to our citizens and law enforcement officers from time to time. With that in mind, the department is creating a volunteer Sheriff's Chaplain program. We are seeking interested clergy and congregants from local churches to participate as trained volunteer chaplains.

The volunteer chaplains will:

- Participate in scheduled chaplain meetings
- Often accompany deputies on ride-alongs during their shift
- Provide spiritual support in situations to both law enforcement personnel and those whose situation law enforcement has been called on to address
- From time-to-time respond to deaths and complete death notifications
- Visit at the hospital and attend funerals if requested

A brief overview of preparation for this volunteer program includes:

- An interview with the Sheriff and coordinator on Monday, December 6th
- A background check to assess eligibility
- Participation in a training program to equip volunteer chaplains

Training and uniform shirt will be provided through the Sheriff's Office. Once a team of volunteer chaplains has been assembled, we will create a participation roster that works to accommodate the volunteers' schedules.
