"It's the most wonderful time of the year!" goes the old Christmas song that is now playing in all the stores. By the time you read this, you will most likely have enjoyed a Thanksgiving gathering with family and friends. You may be in the flurry of addressing Christmas cards, completing—or getting started on—putting up decorations, buying gifts and getting together all you will need to host or take things to holiday parties and Christmas dinners. Excitement is in the air!

But it is also a time of the year when dysfunctional family dynamics can raise their ragged heads. Some of us will feel a more profound grief as we remember and miss those no longer here. Others may experience a deeper loneliness as they are unable to connect with loved ones far away. Though joyful, this can also be a very trying time.

Advent is the holy season that gets the complexities of our lives. Like the deep soil that holds a seed, Advent holds the disappointment of dreams denied and the grief of loss, as well as the remembrance of God's faithfulness and anticipation of the surprising ways God is preparing to enter into both the joy and the mess of our lives as we continue to live them.

The thing about the infant Messiah who comes to save the world is the incredible vulnerability in which he enters the human sphere. No pageantry. No royal protection. Just a feeding trough made into a makeshift cradle in a cave that housed livestock at an inn along a highway. That's about as rough and messy an entry as anyone could have, yet it is infused with the greatest tenderness and the most clarified light. And that is how and where God chooses to begin engaging anew in the world and in our lives.

The birth of Jesus is the moment we see God enter our world in a way we would never expect to bring new life into the messy wilderness places of our lives. Advent gives us a moment to reflect on and receive the hope, the peace, the joy, and the love God is bringing.

We also had **sixteen more blankets** completed for the Ouray County law enforcement to keep in their vehicles to use in cases of emergency or rescue. Many thanks to those that made these blankets!

Our **November Ouray Food Pantry** emphasis has gone marvelously! Cindi took a load of items to the Food Pantry along with 26 pounds of meat donations. We will continue to collect holiday items and take them over as the donation area gets full. Know that your generous donations serve the nutritionally underserved residents of Ouray County in an efficient and respectful manner by providing ongoing food support to individuals and

families who are struggling with difficult life circumstances.
